## 2011 Summer Camps



Fiengo Farm Summer Camps are designed for children from ages 8 to 18 to learn and enjoy the pleasures and responsibilities of horses in a safe, relaxed atmosphere.

### Camp Activities

Horseback Riding - daily 2 Hour riding/ring etiquette lesson, camp horse show Friday (with prizes).

Horsemanship - Classes on basic horse care, tack care, feeding basics.

Arts & Crafts - arts & crafts activities

Classroom Activities - Equine Specialist Speakers and Demonstrations

Sports - Badminton, Shuffle Board, Relay Races/Games, Free Time

2011 Weekly Camp Session Dates: June 13<sup>th</sup> - 17<sup>th</sup>, June 20<sup>th</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup>, July 4<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup>, July 11<sup>th</sup> - 15<sup>th</sup>, July 18<sup>th</sup> - 22<sup>nd</sup>  
Daily Time Sessions: 8 A.M. to 2 P.M.

We offer a structured camp environment based on the camper's skill level for their safety, enjoyment, and education in the world of horses. Each camper has the opportunity to compete in our weekly summer camp horse show, using the skills learned during their summer camp session. Prizes will be given.

### Rules/Regulations:

All children must wear a helmet during camp and the show, even if the child is riding their own personal horse (Coggins Required). Parental release forms for horse camp must be signed and turned in with the deposit. A parent or guardian must be present for the camper to compete in the show. Parents must state what level their child is on the camp application:

**New Beginner Classes** - These classes are for children with very little or no experience with horses. Children will be restricted to walking on the horses unless otherwise directed by the Camp Director. This camp will focus on learning the basics of proper riding, basic horse care, and basic tack upkeep.

**Beginner / Intermediate Classes** - These classes are for children who have been around horses, and maybe gone on a few trail rides, but would like to improve their riding skills, and become familiar with the daily aspects of horses. This camp will focus on achieving intermediate camp riding abilities, with pattern riding, second level horse care,

**Intermediate Classes** - These classes are for children with some riding experience, who are capable of controlling their horse at a trot or equivalent gait. Children will be restricted to a trot or equivalent gait unless otherwise directed by the Camp Director. This camp will focus on second level riding, learning collection, ring etiquette, more advanced horse care, basic medical care.

**Intermediate/Advanced Classes** - These classes are for children with good riding experience, who are capable of controlling their horse at a canter. Children will be restricted to a canter unless otherwise directed by the Camp Director. This camp will focus on high second level and the beginning of advanced level riding, learning the uses of collection, advanced ring etiquette, more advanced horse care and basic medical care. This camp is best for kids that want to go faster, but are not yet ready for serious speed or concentrated ring etiquette.

**Advanced Classes** - These classes are for children with strong riding experience, who are capable of controlling their horse at the canter or gallop. Children will be permitted to canter or gallop their horses in controlled situations. This camp will focus on advanced level riding, reining patterns, along with professional horse care (show horses) and basic veterinary care. This camp basically is for those who are very comfortable with their horses, or if they don't yet have a horse, are strong riders who have ridden steadily (minimum once a week) for at least a year.

Camp Fee includes equestrian lessons, riding, entry in the weekly Summer Camp Horse Show, use of Sport/Game Equipment, Arts & Crafts supplies and instruction, and supervision.

Camp Fee does not include sales tax, insurance, transportation to and from camp, additional purchases, lunch/snacks/drinks, or photographs.

**You can bring your own horse (Coggins required)! We have facilities to board outside horses; however we only have a limited number of stalls. First come, First serve.**

To register your child for camp:

Camp is limited to 10 children per camp and filled on a first come, first serve basis.

To ensure a place for your child at camp, please call Angela Fiengo to reserve a spot at 321-549-1255. You must obtain and sign a camp registration form, a medical release form and a liability release form. Return them with a \$50 non-refundable deposit no later than three weeks prior to the camp date selected. The remaining balance can be submitted the first day of camp and is non-refundable once the weekly camp has begun. The weekly camp fee is \$100 without a stall, \$125 with a stall. There is a \$35 fee for a returned check. You can sign up for multiple weeks and increase your level of experience each week at the Director's discretion.

#### **Summer Camp Supply List**

Long pants to ride horses - jeans, jodhpurs, comfy pants (must cover underpants and backside when bending/kneeling/stretching and must not be ripped/torn/shredded)

T-shirts (must cover midriff when raising/stretching arms – no tying or binding shirt)

Nice shirt for camp horse show

Change of clothes (must still follow above criteria)

Riding Helmet – must fit properly and be SEI approved.

Towel

Western, Riding, or Barn Boots. Tennis shoes may be brought for game activities. No open shoes/flip flops.

Labeled lunch, snacks, and drinks are to be brought by each camper each day. We have a refrigerator to store items in.

**Remember, NO electronic items! (Cell phones, radios, iPods, Gameboys, etc.) If these items are discovered, they will be taken from the camper and returned at the end of camp.**

No Cell Phones - No phone calls except for emergencies - Director and designated Camp Assistants will have phones.

No valuables (jewelry, spending money, etc.)

No personal radios, cd/tape players of any type

No gameboys/playstations, etc.

Campers are not allowed to smoke, have illegal drugs or alcohol. Breaking this rule will result in immediate dismissal with no refund.

No weapons, knives, matches, fireworks or other dangerous items are allowed.

All medication including non-prescription must be kept with the Camp Director/Coordinator.

Destructive behavior is not permitted. Respect wildlife, camp animals, and our property.

Fighting, physical or verbal, is not permitted. No profanity or inappropriate conversations. Respect others at all times.

Campers are expected to be present at all scheduled activities and to remain in supervised areas at all times. Leaving camp property

with anyone other than a parent or guardian is not permitted. Parent/Guardian must sign you out daily.

All directives given by the Camp Director, Assistants, Host or Hostess must be followed as directed

While working with the horses (on the ground or riding) absolutely ALL instructions given by the Camp Director or Assistant will be followed immediately, NO deviations from this rule will be tolerated. **Notice** – Fiengo Farms' Camp Director reserves the right to dismiss any participant who, in the camp director's opinion, is disruptive to the best interests of the camp session. The camper will forfeit all fees paid.
